GATI SHAKTI CARGO TERMINALS

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the progress made in the development of Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals (GCTs) including the number of terminals commissioned and under implementation across the country;**
- (b) the major commodities and industrial sectors benefiting from these terminals and the impact on freight movement;**
- (c) the present operational status of the Tummalacheruvu Gati Shakti Cargo Terminal in Palnadu district, Andhra Pradesh including the details of freight handled and the benefits accrued to local industries, agriculture and logistics;**
- (d) the details of locations of Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals developed in the State of Rajasthan;**
- (e) whether any new locations have been approved for Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals particularly in Palnadu District, Andhra Pradesh, Keonjhar Lok Sabha Constituency, Odisha, Narkatiaganj, Bihar, Rajasthan and nearby mineral and industrial corridors during the Financial Year 2026-27 and if so, the details thereof; and**
- (f) the impact of these terminals on freight handling capacity, multimodal connectivity, logistics efficiency and transportation of minerals and industrial goods particularly from Andhra Pradesh and Keonjhar Lok Sabha Constituency, Odisha?**

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (f) OF STARRED QUESTION NO.52 TO BE ANSWERED ON 22.07.2026 IN LOK SABHA

(a) to (f) : In order to encourage setting up of cargo terminals through private investment, 'Gati Shakti Multi-Modal Cargo Terminal (GCT)' policy has been launched. Location of the GCTs is decided on the basis of demand from industry, potential of Cargo traffic, availability of railway infrastructure and overall logistics potential of the area.

So far, 142 Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals (GCTs) have been commissioned. In addition, In-Principle Approvals (IPAs) have been granted for the development of GCTs at 310 more locations. The 142 commissioned GCTs have an estimated freight handling capacity of 224 million tonnes per annum (MTPA). The policy has mobilized private investment of approximately ₹10,000 crore through these GCTs. Freight handled at these GCTs during 2025-26 is 146 MT.

State-wise detail of GCTs are as under:

In addition to above, In-principle approvals (IPAs) for 14 locations have been given.

In Palnadu district of Andhra Pradesh one GCT has already been commissioned at Tummalacheruvu on 31.01.2023. Traffic handled at this location during 2025-26 is 1.214 MT. Further, one more GCT is under construction in the region. These terminals will improve freight handling capacity of industry and enable efficient transportation of bulk cement, clinker, minerals, industrial goods and other commodities from Palnadu district, Andhra Pradesh by facilitating efficient, reliable and economical movement through rail mode to various destinations across India and promote regional economic development.

In addition to above, In-principle approvals (IPAs) for 08 locations have been given.

At present, no proposal of GCT at Narkatiaganj has been received from the industry.

The Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals cater to a wide range of commodities including cement, steel, foodgrains, fertilizers, coal, fly ash, minerals, containers, automobiles, agricultural produce and other bulk as well as non-bulk commodities. The policy has benefited key sectors such as cement, steel, power, mining, agriculture, logistics and manufacturing by providing improved rail connectivity and modern cargo handling infrastructure. The development of GCTs has enhanced rail freight movement through faster and more efficient loading/unloading, reduced first-mile and last-mile logistics costs, improved wagon turnaround, and facilitated modal shift of freight from road to rail, thereby improving the overall efficiency and competitiveness of rail-based logistics.

The Gati Shakti Cargo Terminal (GCT) Policy has facilitated the development of modern multimodal cargo terminals closer to production and consumption centres, thereby improving rail connectivity for local industries, agricultural

produce and other commodities. The policy has enabled creation of warehousing, silos, cold storage and other value-added logistics facilities. This has enhanced the competitiveness of local industries and farmers while generating employment and promoting regional economic development.
